 - o Paper 2: Thematic Studies

- Paper 1 consists of two question/answer booklets, one for Christianity and one for Islam.
- Each paper is 1 hour and 45 minutes long.
- Each section should be answered in 25 minutes.
- Each section comprises of 5 questions: 1 mark, 2 marks, 4 marks, 5 marks and 12 marks,
- Questions 1-4 are knowledge based questions.
- Question 5 is an evaluation question, where students have to respond to a statement and come to a justified conclusion.
